



Extreme Violence on Campus and in the Workplace: Assessment, Prevention, and Emergency Response

The so-called ‘active shooter’ is a person or persons who participate in a shooting spree with no other intent than to cause serious physical harm or death.

Active shooters (mass homicides), hostage situations, and barricaded subjects are tragically part of the security landscape in America today. Virginia Tech; the Amish Schoolhouse in Nickel Mines, Pennsylvania; Citigroup Center in Chicago; All-Tech Investment Services in Atlanta; the Empire State Building in New York City; Columbine High School - even NASA is not immune to the tragic phenomenon of extreme violence in our schools and workplaces.

How can schools, government, and private companies effectively combat this problem?

Our seminar provides security forces, administrators, and the workforce with concrete tools needed to assess, prevent, respond to, and increase survivability to acts of extreme violence. The seminar utilizes a blended approach that combines behavioral aspects of the violent offender with the security industry’s best practices. We begin by walking our seminar participants through the psychology of the violent offender with an emphasis on recognizing various behavioral traits and characteristics and handling the potentially violent person. We then examine prevention, deterrence, and response with a discussion on increasing one’s survivability during an actual incident. We conclude with a tailored scenario-based tabletop exercise that highlights our client’s vulnerabilities

and those business practices that may increase risks from an active shooter. The exercise identifies procedural shortfalls and provides simple, yet effective solutions to reduce risks.
